PE and Sport Premium Grant 2018/19

At West Newcastle Academy we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better. We welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding for two years to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for physical activity.

The exact amount of PE and Sport Premium Grant that we will receive is £16,270.

What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).

This funding will be spent towards the salary of funding additional teachers and teaching assistants to support outdoor learning in forest, beach and other outdoor learning activities. This results in children who enjoy outdoor, adventurous activities and helps develop their gross and fine motor skills. Our children are strong and able to understand how to keep their bodies healthy and how to stay safe outdoors. This outdoor activity, by its very nature, supports physical development and physical activity and coordination.

WNA will use some of its funding to purchase sport and playground equipment for children, which will enhance their enjoyment of sport and games, and this means there will be opportunities to engage those children who are less keen on physical activities, as well as challenge the more able pupils. It will also be used to provide PE equipment for the new school such as mats, small apparatus and benches.

Each week we have various after school clubs available such as dance and sport clubs that will be provided without charge to our pupil premium children.

WNA are mindful to use their sports funding in a way that will change the culture of the school to ensure the sustainability of physical activity. This is being achieved by focusing on activities that will be embedded into school culture and providing residential activities which focus on Outdoor and Adventure education and that will be of benefit for the whole school.
