Hello everyone

On Sunday the government announced that schools **MAY** be allowed to open after half term in June 2020. We think this would happen in stages beginning with Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. We are working closely with all Newcastle schools (the Local Authority, including with Public Health) to ensure this is done safely for everyone. This arrangement may be part time and will be gradual so that all parents can have confidence in the arrangements for the return of their children.

What does this mean for WNA?


