Answer the following questions using full sentences: What are trolls supposed to eat? What did the troll take with him? What did the troll use to dig the hole? Why did the troll throw away the gold? Why were the troll's knees knocking when he was walking the plank?

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- Read a story of your choice, once you have read the story can you tell someone what happened in the story? Before you read the story can you predict what might happen?
- Have a think and use your imagination to think about what is in the treasure box. Write some sentences (at least 3 sentences) and see if you can use some adjectives to describe the treasure.

Topic

Our topic this term is: A Treasure Island:
